

Digital Waste Tracking Compliance

As part of our commitment to environmental responsibility, regulatory compliance, and transparent waste management practices, W&S are fully prepared for and compliant with the Digital Waste Tracking requirements that come into force on 1 October 2026 in England and Wales. The legislation is introduced through the Digital Waste Tracking framework and associated regulations, requiring waste receiving sites to digitally record and report waste movements through the UK-wide Digital Waste Tracking Service.
